Need a tray for your meal? There are now trays in the dining hall for people who need trays. They are in a stack on a counter just a few feet past where you swipe your card upon arrival. They are compostable, so if you put your tray with your dirty dishes at the end of the meal the dining hall staff will compost them. **Please leave trays for those with young children and mobility challenges.** Encourage parents with small children to go to the head of dining lines and offer to help.

There are many opportunities to care for Friends during Sessions, holding a door, helping someone move in, carrying a tray in the dining hall. We invite you to offer help to a Friend who might want a helping hand.
